Information for parents

BEFORE AND AFTER SCHOOL PROVISION AT HJS

2025-2026

For many of our children, the school day does not start and end in the classroom.

For working parents, it is important to know that children can be looked after and productively engaged in enjoyable activities before and after school, with the same high standard of safety and care that we provide throughout the school day.

We've broken our provision down into three categories: Breakfast Club, After School Activities and After School Care.

BREAKFAST CLUB

For children whose parents need to get to work early in the morning, we offer a Breakfast Club from 8:00am every day. This takes place in Henleaze Infant School. When you arrive on site from the Park Grove entrance, take the pathway to the left to head up to the Infant School entrance and sign them in there.

The Breakfast Club is staffed by employees of the Infant School. It offers pupils from Reception to Year 6 a light breakfast before engaging them in a free play session with crafts and games.

At 8:45am, Breakfast Club staff escort the junior children to the junior school gates. They enter school along with the rest of their year group.

Parents must register with Breakfast Club by completing a <u>Registration Form</u>. Once registered, you can book regular days. To check availability for occasional extra days, send an email to <u>breakfastclubhenleazei@bristol-schools.uk</u>.

Breakfast Club is open to children who attend Henleaze Infant School and Henleaze Junior School. The cost is £5 per session.

AFTER SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

Henleaze Junior School staff may offer some after-school activities, such as Choir, Orchestra or Code Club. Parents and carers will be informed by the school when such clubs are available and how to apply for places.

In addition to any extra-curricular clubs that may be offered by Henleaze Junior School staff, we work with our partners at Shine to offer a choice of sport and other activities every day.

All Shine activities are booked and paid for on the Henleaze Junior School page on their website. They must be booked in advance. Parents will need to create a user account. Clubs must be paid for when they are booked. In cases of financial hardship, parents may enquire at the school office about the possibility of financial support. We aim for all of our activities to be fully inclusive. If a child requires support to access the activity, parents are asked to contact Shine, who will make the necessary arrangements.

Activities run from the end of the school day until 4:45pm. At the end of the session, parents collect children from the gateway to the front lawn outside the Dining Hall.

Shine activities are led by qualified instructors, who are all fully DBS checked and trained in safeguarding and health and safety matters. Children can sign up for a single session, or for a term in advance.

Shine After School Activities are open to children who attend Henleaze Junior School.

Henleaze Infant School also work with Shine to offer activities for the younger children. These must be booked separately, on the Henleaze Infant School page on the Shine website.

AFTER SCHOOL CARE

For children of working parents at Henleaze Infant School and Henleaze Junior School, the <u>Schools Out Play Scheme</u> offers a wide range of play activities to choose from; structured and unstructured play, indoor and outdoor games, arts and crafts such as cooking and construction as well as sports such as football, dodgeball and skipping. They also provide a quiet area for reading and homework. Schools Out runs five days a week until 5:45pm in Henleaze Infant School. Full details of costs and how to apply are available on their website.

Children who are registered with Schools Out are collected from the junior school playground by Schools Out staff at 3:25pm. For children who attend an after-school activity at the junior school, Schools Out can be booked for the final hour only, and their staff will collect children from the junior school when their activity ends.
