Matters arising from the last meeting

<p>We would like to reward children for Random Acts of Kindness. If children are noticed doing random acts of kindness, they could be given a ticket.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You could give a voucher to spend in the school shop when someone gets three RAK tickets. It might encourage everyone to be kinder. You might do kind things and not be noticed by the teacher. Children could spot you being kind and report it to the teacher. The person who you are kind to could report it to the teacher. You would have to actually witness the RAK, not just hear about it. It wouldn't matter if you were not noticed: doing the RAK would make you feel good, and that is enough reward. Class 6	
<p>We would like to have class pets</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You would have to consider that some people have allergies to some animals. Who would look after it in the holidays? The teacher? You could have a pet monitor to be in charge of feeding and cleaning. Animals are good for stress relief and anxiety. It should be a small animal, like a hamster, or fish. People don't tend to be allergic to fish, because they don't touch them. Algae in the fish tank makes it hard to clean. An animal in the classroom might distract children from their work. Who would pay for the animal and who would pay for the food and anything else it needs? What would happen to the pet at the end of the year? Would it move on with the children, or stay in the class? Should you have the same type of pet in every class, to be fair? Could it be a year group pet or a school pet? <p>There are lots of advantages and disadvantages to consider, and teachers would have to agree to the idea.</p> <p>Action: All school councillors lead a discussion in the class and make lists of all the benefits and problems of school pets, and bring them to the next meeting.</p>	ALL

<p>In Friday Assembly, could we have a Class Of The Week and give them a reward – for example they look after the school pet for a week.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> How would you decide which class wins? The problem with team points is that some teachers give out more than others. <p>There are already lots of reward systems, and lots to celebrate in Friday assembly. We might add the Random Acts of Kindness.</p> <p>Action: None</p>	
Class 11	
<p>Could we have a maze, painted on the floor, either on the field or the playground?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> If you spray paint on the field, it will disappear when you cut the grass. On the playground, you would have to think about whether it would get in the way of games such as tag. It might actually lead to children making up new games, and it wouldn't matter if you wanted to run over the maze. It might need to be supervised by a teacher so it is used properly. <p>Vote: The majority like the idea of a maze painted on the playground.</p> <p>Action: Mr B will ask HENSA if they can consider paying for new playground markings, to include a maze.</p>	Mr B
